In her new position, she is responsible for the overall strategy, development and execution of this program that is now in its 5th season.

Hard work, God-gifted talent and acquired skills are just a few qualities of Sapp's rolling credits. Sapp's tenured path of success began when CBS' Anchor Dan Rather handpicked her to join the prestigious team of producers at the CBS Network in New York. Her body of work includes the following shows: "The CBS Evening News," "Street Stories with Ed Bradley," "Public Eye with Bryant Gumbel" and Houston's own "Deborah Duncan" show. She has also worked with notable personalities Deborah Norville, John Travolta, Celine Dion and Dustin Hoffman.
